Dear Friends

I start with the sad news that shocked us all at St Peter's, Revd Roy Goodchild who has taken nearly all our Sunday 10am services since February died suddenly on November 4th. After a private cremation there was a service of thanksgiving for his life on Wednesday 12th November at Kingston near Lewes. The Church was packed and his family contributed with verses, a reading and stories from his life. It was a beautiful service and we all came away uplifted thinking that Roy had been called to greater things, he was a wonderful ambassador for the Church and there were many representatives from various Parishes all of whom had felt the benefit of Roy's ministry.

We in Chailey were truly blessed as not only has he taken our Sunday services since February and for almost a year during the last Interregnum but willingly took on the additional work needed for weddings, baptisms and funerals. He will be truly missed.

During the last Interregnum Roy shared the services with Revd John Morris and fortunately for us John is available to take most of our Sunday services with the Revd Bill Kemm upto the end of the year. At the time of writing we are still working on who will take the Christmas services as John is unavailable but we are sure the Lord will provide.

Where has the year gone? With this magazine comes a Greetings Card with every good wish for Christmas. It gives you the arrangements that we and the Free Church have made for the Christmas services. I hope that what we have planned will enable you and your families to share in our Christmas worship and to praise and thank God for the joy of Christmas and the gift of His own Son to be our Saviour. We certainly need Him. Whatever progress the past 2000 years have seen, each of us personally still falls victim to our own self will and self concern from time to time, if not all the time, and that leads to the friction that arises between us, between groups and nations. Peace in the world can only come through peace in human hearts and that is an area that only God in Christ can reach and change for the better in a way that Heineken's cannot.

May God bless you all this season. Do come and join us in worship.

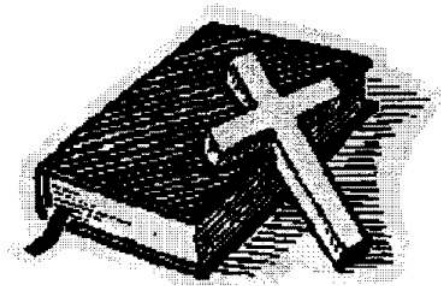

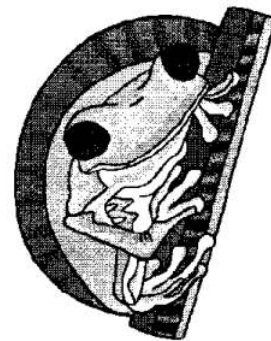
If you are a mum, dad or carer of a child from birth to three years of age, and would like to meet new friends in a friendly child-safe environment, why not pop in to Hoppers?

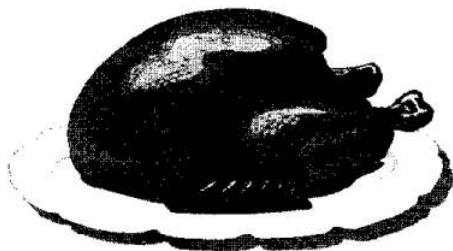
You can collect the Christmas Fare you have ordered on Friday 12th or Friday 19th December, at the last market day before the holiday.

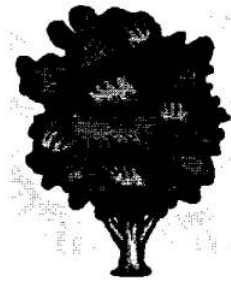
Carols & mulled wine Saturday 13th December at 4.30 p.m

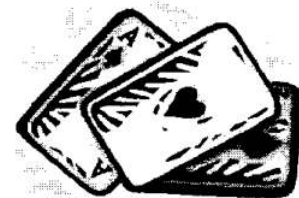

COUNCILLOR'S CORNER *By Sharon Davy*

MARKSTAKES CORNER

Drainage systems can create very unpleasant problems and indeed health hazards for householders. It is a delicate subject, but one that I hope I dealt with

swiftly and effectively. The Chief Engineer at Lewes District Council advised me that unfortunately, due to the misuse of drainage systems in general, i.e. disposal of nappies, masonry, cutlery, toys, etc. the interceptors block up and become a regular maintenance issue. Hopefully this problem is solved.

CHAILEY LINK WALK - OVERGROWN VEGETATION

It was very helpful to learn that the path south of Downs View was practically impassable. When a local resident reported this problem, I contacted East Sussex County Council, Rights of Way Officer and asked them to clear the path. They have been extremely helpful and even though clearance is not normally a high priority the work has been done. They rely heavily on the public informing them when they come across a problem on one of the paths and are grateful for as much information as we can give on the location of the path and of the particular problem, so please let them know of similar problems. Do bear in mind that parts of the Chailey Link route cross common land and are maintained by the Countryside Management team.

FINANCE – LEWES DISTRICT COUNCIL

I have been contacted by many residents asking whether their District Council has any money invested in an Icelandic institution. The answer is one million pounds.

NEW POST – ASSISTANT COMMUNITY RANGER IN LEWES DISTRICT COUNCIL

In the current financial climate, a new position has been approved by Cabinet. This is advertised on the Lewes District website or telephone the Personnel section. The gross salary shall be between: £20,582 - £22,573 per annum, for a flexible 37 hour week with pension. The total staff related budget to Lewes District Council is £30,450. The main duties will be to assist the existing Community Ranger in the following core sites:

Lewes Railway Land LNR, Landport Bottom Lewes, Castle Hill, LNR, Newhaven, The Old Brickfields, Seaford, Lake Park, Peacehaven, Bollens Bush, Markstakes Common

Councillors and the Parish Clerk wish all our residents a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Roy Goodchild: the Reverend Roy Goodchild died on November 4th. Parish Councillors welcome the tribute paid to him by the Churchwardens in this issue of *Chailey News*.

Guy Fawkes Day: congratulations to the Bonfire Society for a superb display of fireworks and a truly impressive bonfire to explode Guy Fawkes. The Society recorded Chailey Cricket Club's 250th Anniversary in their displays and fired off a second display to rap music set by Chailey Youth Club. The Bonfire Society works at both ends of the age spectrum, giving a display suitable for younger people and funding Christmas Lunch for the elderly.

In common with other societies, the Bonfire Society is a worthy cause in need of more hands to help with its tasks – do join.

Financial matters: The annual timetable is remorseless and, once again, Councillors will be considering the Precept – the sum of money which we ask Lewes District Council to collect on our behalf to pay for the services for which we are responsible.

What are those services? Mowing and upkeep of green spaces; insurance cover for Council property and activities; support for Chailey Parish Hall, Chailey Youth Group and the Sports Ground; Grants to village organisations; salary and expenses of the Parish Clerk; safeguarding of our open spaces (the Parish owns significant areas of Chailey Common). And in addition, this year we spent some £5,000 to survey and make safe the trees for which we are responsible; and £3,500 on a new bus-shelter at the junction with Mill Lane.

Councillors have in mind before 2011 three major items of expenditure: Chailey Sports Club's project for a new pavilion; the re-painting of Chailey Windmill; and, on our wish-list, an improved recreational facility in South Chailey. We have some £62,000 in our reserves, earmarked for these major projects.

Councillors will again face the decision as to whether to increase our Precept by a significant amount (£10,000 plus) to go towards the cost of major projects; or whether to anticipate that the projects can be phased over several financial years. The cost of Chailey Parish Council to a Band D household is £33.79, significantly less than the cost of similar Parish Councils, there would be room for us to increase the precept on a straight comparison. So, given the economic climate this year (which matches the weather) Councillors will consider at their meeting on December 9 how to square this circle.

Our organising committee needs 4 or 5 extra people to help with innovative ideas for fund raising, and we specifically need a secretary to keep our administrative affairs in order and someone IT literate to manage our web-site (I think that we have one out there___somewhere!). We also need members to proudly wear a bonfire jumper and flat cap and help with events. This year we managed to get enough people together to march with other societies; we flew the flag for Chailey at Fletching, Newick and Lindfield and it was great fun.
