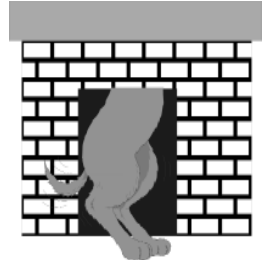

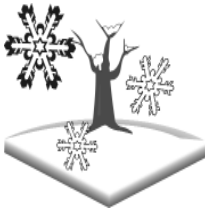

Village Information Point

The Village Information Point sessions are held on Tuesday mornings at the Coffee Stop, Free Church, South Chailey. In November sessions will be held on Tuesday 8th and Tuesday 22nd November between 10.00 am and 12.00. The dates of VIP sessions to the end of the year have been posted on the Council's notice boards.

You too can become a Parish Councillor!

We should like to co-opt one person onto the Parish Council, preferably someone who lives in South Chailey, since many of the existing Councillors live near Chailey Green or in North Chailey. Parish Councillors advise on planning and development within the village; dispose of a budget of some £48,000 to maintain village facilities or to encourage voluntary activities; and represent village interests to the District and County Councils – not such dry work as it sounds? Contact the Clerk or the Chair to find out more about being a local Councillor.

Diamond Jubilee

We believe we shall have the necessary funds to mark the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in a suitable way, and would be grateful for suggestions as to how best to do this. We are considering replacement benches at key spots in the village, but also thinking to commission an ornamental map of our village. Suggestions are needed before the end of the year so that we can set the wheels in motion.

Highways

The Parish Council meets every quarter with East Sussex County Council Highways and, on September 23rd, took the opportunity to thank Highways for the re-surfacing work on the A275 and A272. Speed limits were also discussed and Highways confirmed that the public advertisement for the proposed speed limit between the Brickworks and Markstake has now been published. Limits on the A275 and A272 are currently slated for the next Financial Year.

Design work continues on two projects: a footpath along Warrs Hill; and a pedestrian crossing at Mill Lane, South Chailey. Funding for these projects expires in July 2012; eventually, a choice will have to be made, depending on which project can be completed within the time available, unless the time-limit can be extended. Cllr. Meg Stroude kindly followed up our complaint about changes with no prior warning to the bus timetable; Countryliner have advised that they were 'behind with roadside publicity'.

Review of Parliamentary Constituencies in England

The Boundary Commission for England is currently reviewing the Parliamentary constituency boundaries in England. It is proposed to reduce the constituencies allocated for Brighton and Hove, East Sussex, Kent and Medway from a total of 25 to 24. A Lewes and Brighton East constituency ward is proposed containing eight wards from Brighton and Hove and four wards from Lewes District, including Chailey and Wivelsfield. A new Uckfield constituency is proposed including Newhaven, Seaford and Newick wards. Consultation on the proposals will end on 5th December 2011. Further details may

Digital TV Switchover in Meridian

It's now less than four months to the start of the digital switchover in the Meridian TV region. When the switch happens depends on the transmitter which broadcasts a TV signal to your home. In East Sussex the switch will happen in two stages, on 30th May 2012 the BBC2 analogue will be switched off, all remaining analogue channels will be switched off on 13th June 2012.
