



Dear Friends

Welcome to the April edition of our Church & Community Magazine.

I'd like to start this month with a huge thank you to all of you who have supported our Youth Work Appeal and to all who have continued to support our Pastoral Care provision at both St Peter's and St Mary's Newick.

You have been so generous, and I pleased to say we now have the funding we need to provide our Youth and Families Work for another year.

April is always a time of thanksgiving, during this month we will finally turn that corner of the lighter and longer days, with winter a rather soggy and dismal distant memory. Each Easter Day we hold a Sunrise Service at St Mary's Newick, and as the light and the warmth slowly evaporate the mist and chill of the darkness, there is always a powerful sense of joy, hope and a new beginning.

But looking at our Bible readings this April, I'm reminded that it would have been a very different beginning for the followers of Jesus at the birth of the early church. This month we will again read the powerful testimonies, of what it was like to be present at that first Easter.

First Mary, Salome & Mary Magdalene, then Peter and John go to the tomb and find it empty—perhaps the guards came and stole away the body? They are confused and greatly concerned. Angels appear and the risen Christ remind them of what Jesus had told them before His death. They are understandably perplexed, confused, and do not know what to do . . . but they go to tell the others the Good News. No one really knows what to think, but some conclude it is an idle tale and they do not believe them.

While all this is going on, two disciples decide to leave, to get away from Jerusalem. They begin their journey, thoroughly confused. Jesus comes alongside them and asks them what they are talking about.

They do not recognize Jesus, because His death is so firmly fixed in their memory that they have no room, so to speak, for a miracle. Jesus draws them out by asking questions, and He gives them a teaching on the Scriptures that I would have loved to be part of. He explains to them the meaning of the prophecies.

When they arrive in Emmaus, the disciples intend to stop, and Jesus appears to continue to walk away, continuing His journey. However, something must have touched their hearts as Jesus had opened the full meaning of the Word to them about the Messiah.

The disciples invite Him and encourage Him to stay with them. Jesus accepts their invitation, but as He blessed the bread, broke it, and shared it with them—as Scripture says, "Their eyes were opened, and they recognized Him in the breaking of the bread." Jesus vanishes, and these two disciples quickly hurry back to Jerusalem, where they previously had been so profoundly discouraged and frightened. What an extraordinary moment!

This month as we each share in that Emmaus journey; I want you to notice how they came to recognize Him. Jesus revealed Himself to them in two very important ways—

through the sharing the Good News and the breaking of bread!

Please pay attention to this. Please think about examining your own journey this month, so that reading the Word and frequently participating the community of communion can be part of your journey!

Is there a faith in you which is longing to be awakened? Is this month the time for you to allow God's word into your hearts, is this a season of new beginnings, a chance to change and transform you? If it is why come and see what is happening at one of our Sunday Services, there is a warm welcome for all.

Have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

Chailey Commons Society

At last, a break in the winter rains, and how good it is to see the sun shining brightly. There has been an amazing show of daffodils, and the bluebells are showing strongly in the woodlands. These, together with wood anemones, wild snowdrops, and the yellow Lesser Celandine make a wonderful show, using the light from above before the tree canopy grows over and makes the woodland floor darker again.

We have held the AGM which included a raffle table by the local Guides Rangers, an update on her Ashdown Forest Nightjars Project from Izzy Kennedy and another magnificent display of local old maps and photographs and postcards staged by Tony Turk. This gives us a lovely opportunity to get together afterwards and meet and exchange memories.

Down at Markstakes Common the volunteer group, meeting on Mondays, have continued the winter work of clearing brambles and birch seedlings from another glade. Whilst it has been very wet, this has softened the ground which makes digging easier to remove the roots, using special forked tools, which is an essential part in successful clearing.

Our meetings continue this month with firstly a new special Easter Trail meeting at 2.00.p.m. on Sunday 7th April at the Sports Club pavilion on Memorial Common. Members and families and children are invited to come along and try a circuit of the common following clues in words and pictures to discover and learn more about the commons.

Secondly, we have a spring bird walk with Adrian on Saturday April 13th starting at 8.00.a.m. at the Pound Common car park. We will be looking and listening for both the resident birds and the early migrants so bring binoculars.

Thirdly, I will be leading a spring walk on Pound Common on Saturday April 27th starting at 2.30.p.m. from the car park. A leisurely stroll of about a mile when we will be looking for the early flowers and plants growing again and anything else which might be of interest.

Chailey Horticultural Society

The arrival of April brings with it a multitude of tasks to do in the garden and vegetable plot. By mid April it is safe to place tomato plants in the borders of greenhouses and poly tunnels. There is a saying "we are what we eat "and what a plant grows in defines its strengths and the flavour of its fruit.

For good strong plants and especially good flavoured fruit tomatoes need to be grown in ground rich in well rotted horse manure with added lime and magnesium sulphate. For flavour tradition has it that wood ash, soot and seaweed need to be added and the fruit allowed to ripen on the truss with as much sunshine as possible to ensure maximum sweetness. Fundamentally that is the difference between home grown and commercially grown tomatoes whatever the original root stock.

Now is the time to start frost tender plants under protection prior to planting out at the end of May or early June. Essential here are courgettes, sweetcorn and runner beans.

I like green elongated courgettes but others may prefer yellow or round ones!

Plant the seeds in individual pots vertically and pointing slightly upwards. This encourages growth and prevents rotting. Good varieties are Defender F1 and Zucchini.

Home grown sweetcorn is vastly superior to anything you can buy. This is because as soon as the cob is picked the kernels start turning sugars into starch so they loose sweetness and become more mealy. So pick and eat immediately. Start off individual seeds in root trainers. The best early variety is Swift F1 and for later crops try Goldcrest F1 and Moonshine F1.

Almost every vegetable plot in the country will contain runner beans though curiously they are almost exclusively a British obsession and not widely grown on the continent.

For a long harvest start some off under cover in April for planting out in early June and at planting place a seed bean between each plant to ensure the longest possible season. Traditionally grown in a wigwam frame they actually do better with upright canes allowing sun and wind to embrace the plants.

The choice is enormous. Some modern varieties are a cross between a climbing French bean and a runner bean which results in a self fertile type which is probably best for early planting. Try Moonlight and Firestorm. Later try Scarlet Emperor and Enorma, especially for exhibiting. Hopefully at our plant sale on Saturday 18th May these will be available.

April and May are a good time to tidy up stone bearing fruit trees such as plums, damson, peach and apricot. The main purpose is to remove dead and damaged branches and those crossing and open up the centre and to keep the tree to a manageable size as at some stage you are going to have to pick the fruit!

Another job for April is to prune and tidy up the fig tree which to me always seems a hopeless task as there seems to be no order in the way a fig tree grows! Keep the tree to a manageable size and remove dead and crossing branches. Most fruit is born on a lateral growth in its second year so try and keep 6" to 9" between laterals and keep an eye out for the embryonic fruit. Good luck!

Hopefully by the time you read this it will have stopped raining and the sun will be shining.

Chailey Parish Council Liaison Meeting with ESCC Highways

The Council met with Highways in February. Evidently, and following many complaints, we discussed potholes. Telephone reports may be made on 0345 6080193 or, for preference, through the website Welcome to East Sussex Highways live.eastsussexhighways.com Highways requested that residents identify clearly the location of the pothole along the road.

We discussed in particular the A275 in South Chailey but were disappointed to learn that this road is slated for full repair only in 2025/26; however, we were encouraged to report the two drain covers currently lifting. The bridge at Goldbridge is unlikely to be fully repaired before the end of this year. The design for amber-warning lights on the approach to Mill Lane should be completed before Easter, and the gully along the A275 and into Warrs Hill is to be cleared.

Since our meeting the Council has commented on the East Sussex draft Local Transport Plan to the effect that it broadly ignores traffic along the Northern East-West route (A272) – travelling to employment in mid-Sussex and to the Princess Royal, a problem also reflected in the zoning of the recent Flexibus.

Finally, we requested Highways review the pavements and lack of a crossing facility along the A272 opposite Chailey Heritage.

Maria Caulfield MP - Local Update

Losing a baby at any time is tragic. But for parents who lose a baby before 24 weeks gestation, up until now, it has been impossible to formally recognise their baby. In my role as Minister for Women's Health I recently announced the government scheme to allow parents to record and receive a certificate to provide recognition of the loss of their baby before 24 weeks gestation.

This is part of the wider work we are doing around baby loss by firstly reducing the number of still births and neo natal deaths but also ensuring bereaved parents feel supported through their grief and recognise their loss, acknowledging their pain and ensuring they feel heard. The new baby loss certificates will not be compulsory - it remains the choice of all parents to manage the difficult time of a loss, however they see fit.

The new baby loss certificate is available for either or both parents to register the name and date of their baby's death and after registering this on the Government website a certificate will be sent to parents in roughly 14 days time. It is just available in England and to start with will go back to 2018 with the intention of opening this up to all parents shortly.

Other measures as part of the baby loss review include, ending the three miscarriage rule where women had to have three miscarriages before they were entitled to medical help and now they will be assessed after a first miscarriage, ensuring that every maternity unit has a bereavement suite and access to a bereavement midwife and rolling out Early Pregnancy Units in trusts so that women having problems with a pregnancy can attend these rather than A&Es

Citizen's Advice

I've just got my first payslip from a new job. How do I know what it means? All employers are required to give their employees a payslip. This shows your pay, deductions and tax information.

Your payslip should show your and your employers' details and the date you will normally receive your pay.

Your National Insurance (NI) number is used to make sure all your NI contributions are recorded and so you can get any state benefits you're entitled to, including state pension later in life.

Your payslip might show a tax period, the tax year starts in April and ends in March. The number here corresponds to the period in which you're being taxed.

Your tax code is decided by HMRC and is used to work out how much Income Tax to take from your pay. Make sure you're not on an emergency tax code otherwise you'll be taxed more than needed.

Gross pay is the amount you've earned before anything is deducted. Deductions are amounts taken from your gross pay, common ones include: income tax, national insurance, pension or student loan payments. Your net pay is the amount of money you will receive after all the deductions.

Taxable pay is the amount of your salary, to date in the current tax year that has been subjected to tax.


