

Dear friends,

I hope you are all well and that we are enjoying some long awaited summertime?

With the easing of restrictions and life feeling just that tiny bit busier than it should be, and possibly fitting in summer holidays or staycations before us.

I've been thinking a lot about what it really means to be 'present'?

Present as in 'the present' the period of time that is happening now, not the past or the future:

Present with our family, friends and loved ones , present with our communities and present with our God!

I was reading a blog by a young mother who wrote:

"My 20-month-old son is already familiar with a variety of Apple devices. He knows (roughly) how they work and what they are used for.

It's not because he regularly uses them. It's because he sees me on them, all of the time. The other night, I was on my laptop, doing something unimportant, while he played on the floor with his non-digital toys (remember building blocks?). He can't say much yet, but he does know how to say "Dada," over and over again until I give him my attention. But instead of glancing over, I was trying to do too many things at once, looking at something online that didn't need my attention at that moment, while something in the room did.

A moment later, he stopped calling my name, calmly stood up, walked over and closed my laptop while I was still typing. He had my attention.

A kid who isn't even two yet understood more about being present than I did."

Along with changing the way we work, travel, eat and entertain ourselves, technology as changed the way we actually relate to one another.

Most concerningly, the communication revolution ushered has not only changed digital communication, but it has also altered face-to-face relationships.

Everyone that owns a smartphone now carries with them an escape hatch for uncomfortable situations or awkward conversations.

Instead of dealing with social circumstances that used to be the norm, we can distract ourselves with a device that instantly pulls up a feed of more interesting—or comfortable—conversations.

And, even beyond how technology has changed real-world social settings, it has also transformed solitude even the isolation of a lockdown!

How can you ever be alone if thousands of "friends" are also in your pocket?

We've traded silence and reflection for a "feed" of endless noise, custom filtered to our preferences. Beyond anything, it has made us forget how to actually be present.

The digital revolution has empowered constant distraction that allows us to forget about what we are doing at the moment, and instead see images of what we have done, look at what others are doing or plan what we are going to do next.

This is a spiritual crisis.

One of the underlying things we learn about the nature of God in the Bible is that He does not mind waiting.

He seeks stillness.

After creating the universe, God Himself simply remained still and reflected on His work for an entire day. He loves being present so much so that the essence of His Holy Spirit, is presence. God commands us to "Be still, and know that I am God."

He speaks through a "still, small voice," which we hear after we "wait upon the Lord."

When we fill our lives with so many things that distract us from actually being present and lose our ability to be still, we disconnect ourselves from God's design.

The Bible is full of stories of involuntary waiting: Noah and his family waiting 40 days and 40 nights before being able to exit the arc; Abraham and Sarah being forced to wait until they were

very old to have a son; the Israelites wandering in the wilderness for 40 years before entering into the Promised Land;

humanity waiting for the birth of Christ as a saviour; the Church awaiting the Second Coming; Even Jesus spent 40 days in wilderness before His ministry began.

The story God has written is filled with pregnant pauses that are used to make people be present and reflective.

When we fill every still moment in our lives with digital distraction, we edit the way God has penned the story for our lives.

Throughout the Psalms, verses are separated with Selahs—pauses in the music that aren't meant to be filled with words or sounds.

It's a metaphor that still applies to our lives:

There are times that we need to put down our phones or the things that can fill natural moments of quietness, and embrace moments of stillness or intimacy with people we care about.

Being present forces us to deal with things we don't want to have to deal with.

It forces us to reflect.

It forces us to be engaged.

And, sometimes, it forces us outside of our comfort zone.

All of these are good things. This is how life was designed to be lived.

My hope for us all is that this August we will finally have some summer, and with this momentary pause, that in the present, we can find the space to see and hear ourselves as we really are, how we were created to be without the distraction of a de-vice!

Sometimes, experiencing God's presence in our lives is just a matter of being present ourselves. Even if it means closing our laptop for a few minutes.

I was pleased that at the end of May, Openreach outlined plans to build new ultrafast, ultra-reliable Full Fibre broadband for more than three million homes and businesses around the country, including 11,410 in the Lewes Constituency. This will be to cover some of the hardest to reach communities in the UK.

This follows an extended investment commitment by BT which means Openreach will now build Full Fibre technology for 25 million premises by 2026. This will also create a total of 7,000 new jobs across Openreach and the supply chain. Since 2017, Openreach has announced 9,000 apprentice jobs which will help accelerate the deployment of world class digital infrastructure across the UK.

In addition, I welcome the Gigabit Broadband Voucher scheme is now open, providing up to £210m worth of funding through vouchers as immediate help for those experiencing slow broadband speeds in rural areas. Vouchers worth up to £1,500 for homes and £3,500 for businesses are available to selected areas to help to cover the costs of installing gigabit broadband. Residents and businesses can check if they are eligible by visiting the government website.

It is really encouraging that the Government continues to prioritise investment in gigabit-capable broadband. More than a third of UK premises now have access to gigabit-capable connections, up from 9% in July 2019. The Government is also working with the industry to target a minimum of 85% gigabit-capable coverage by 2025, and an ambition to get as close to 100% as possible. The Government has also signed the Shared Rural Network agreement with Mobile Network Operators. The £1 billion deal will increase 4G mobile coverage throughout the UK to 95% by the end of 2025.

I know just how important this is to so many people across the constituency. A large proportion of Lewes and Wealden is made up of rural areas where broadband speeds can unfortunately be very slow. I have had numerous local residents raise this with me in recent years, and I am pleased that after raising these issues with the Government, action is being taken to ensure that people across our harder to reach communities will have access to faster broadband.

From the Parish Mag August 1921

A Congregational Practice took place at St Peters on Sunday Evening the first of a series that we hope to have from time to time. The Rector explained that it was the congregation's duty to contribute heartily and intelligently to those musical portions of the service which fell to their lot. It is a dull service when the congregation takes little or no part. The function of the choir is not to monopolise the singing but to lead it.

The Chailey Dramatic Society hope to give their first performance on Boxing Day this year. The performance will take the form of a short play by W.W. Jacob entitled 'The Monkey's Paw' preceded by a Concert of which the details will appear later on the bills.

Note: The Monkey's Paw is a classic three wishes story that doubles as a horror story and a cautionary tale and was first published in 1902. W.W. Jacobs was married to Agnes Eleanor Williams, the noted suffragette.

Chailey Commons Society

The commons have been rapidly covered once again with the bracken, *Pteridium aquilinum*, taking the lead in the growth stakes. Also, both the Bell Heather, *Erica cinerea*, which favours the damp and wetter areas and Cross-Leaved Heath, *Erica tetralix*, in the drier areas, are making a fine show, to be followed in August by the Ling, *Calluna vulgaris*, the very pretty smaller flowered variety of heather. Heath spotted orchids, *Dactylorhiza macculata*, have been especially good this year.

The Exmoor ponies have settled in well after taking up residence on Red House Common. The water troughs have been cleaned and we must ask that they are kept clean for drinking purposes only – no access or use by dogs and children please for obvious

reasons. There are still instances of dog poo bags being used and then abandoned on the side of paths. This is, of course, very counterproductive to the idea of keeping the commons as clean and plastic free as possible so please may we ask again that the bins provided are used. Dog faeces left on the common can also expose cattle to a parasite that causes infertility or leaves the cattle infected with the parasite. It can also change the flora because it adds nutrients to the nutrient poor heathland encouraging coarse vegetation to out compete heathland plants.

If you walk on the common, best not to approach the ponies - enjoy from a distance! No feeding please - we don't want to encourage the ponies to become greedy for food hanging around instead of foraging for heathland plants. Do take care to control dogs near to them. Check our website for contacts to report anything which does not look right.

If there are issues with livestock including cattle escaping onto neighbouring land or roads (not the roads between the commons where there are cattle grids) please contact the farmer Nick Harvey on 07710 031820. Other issues e.g., fly tipping, litter, dog nuisance, car parks or bins please contact Lewes District Council here: <https://www.lewes-eastbourne.gov.uk/report-a-problem/>.

Activities to look forward to include the children's Bug Hunt on Wednesday 18th August and a new event for this year which is a Young Ecologist Holiday Club for those of ages 6 – 10 years. These should take place on Wednesdays August 11th and 25th for a young ecologist plus an adult in a small group of 8 adults and 8 children. There will be a Late Summer Walk on Saturday 28th August. Chailey Horticultural Society

Sadly due to the restrictions imposed due to Covid-19 we had to cancel our Summer Show although the children's potato growing competition went ahead. We are more hopeful that with the easing of restrictions from mid July we will be able to hold our autumn show on 11th September I have found this quite a difficult year in the garden. A late frost devastated cherry, pear, plum and apple blossom with the consequence of a much reduced crop. A wet and dry cold period in late spring and early summer has definitely held growth back and seems to have hindered germination. However these are tribulations that all gardeners must bear.

August is a month of an abundance of produce from the garden and a time to look forward to securing a supply through the winter.

It is important to keep harvesting beans, courgettes and marrows to ensure continuing cropping. Also keep them well watered using a watering can with water at the ambient temperature and aimed at the base of the plant and keep the leaves dry. Dig early main crop potatoes and only store those that are perfect.

When summer fruiting raspberries have finished cut them down to ground level and tie in the new canes for next year's harvest. Finish pruning currants and gooseberries. Ensure winter brassica plants are well watered and the ground around them firmed down.

Protect from birds , cabbage white butterflies and caterpillars.

Now is the time to plant winter lettuce, either in root trainers or straight in the ground. Try Valdor , Artic King , Winter density and Navara. They can also be grown in a greenhouse or poly tunnel but will benefit from some protection during cold spells. Beware of slugs. Keep watering and feeding greenhouse tomatoes, chillies, sweet peppers and aubergine. Ensure good ventilation during hot spells and always water at the base. In dry spells outside tomatoes will benefit from a feed and watering. It is essential to keep the leaves dry to avoid blight in those varieties susceptible.

Cut back new growth on Wisteria to 5 or 6 leaves. Evergreen foliage plants should be pruned into the desired shape.

With lawns resist the temptation to cut too short as this weakens the the grass and makes it more susceptible to drought.

Agapanthus will now be flowering and start feeding as the flowers fade to ensure a good display next year.

Meeting With Head Of Planning In Chailey

I invited the Head of Planning, Lewes District Council to come to Chailey and give a tailored briefing on the Local Plan and of course, the

North Barnes Farm development which is being proposed by Eton College.

Together with our Chailey Parish Council, we invited fellow representatives from the northern, rural villages to attend. East Chiltington – Plumpton – Barcombe – Ditchling – Wivelsfield as well as our Chailey Chair of Planning and Chair of the the Parish Council. As you can well imagine, we all have strong views on urbanising our countryside - myself included.

On Friday 9th July, the Issues and Options consultation was published. The process of putting a new District Plan in place has started with the call for sites in the Land Availability Assessment earlier this year, with a view to have a new plan in place in late 2023. 80% of of English councils will be making a New Plan. This is a moment when everyone can submit their thoughts – suggestions – forward thinking ideas, etc.

We still have some in our community who do not have access, or are unable to use a computer - and if we know of anyone in our village that feels strongly and wish their views recorded, please let them know and help. We can write to: Matthew Hitchen – Planning Policy Lead at Lewes District Council if responding online is not possible.

The most sustainable settlement in the district is Lewes Town and is the largest town within any English National Park. This puts the onus on our rural, northern villages, as 75% of housing will be out of the South Downs National Park whilst a small 25% is within. In my view, the Park has a Duty to Cooperate and see the demand for new homes within our towns, in particular Lewes Town and the urban coastal towns that have close links with Brighton. There is, in my view, a very strong case for Lewes District Council to make this a priority if they seriously want to protect farmland in the north of the District. I have put this forward on many occasions.

Thank you to those that have contacted me re planning, I am trying to respond individually and it is a very long list.

Back to the workplace: Your rights if you've been working from home

With guidance to work from home set to end from 19 July, Citizens Advice sets out information if you're asked to return to your normal workplace.

I've been working from home, can my employer ask me to return to my normal workplace?

Yes, when you enter into a contract to work for an employer you have to comply with 'reasonable management requests'. That means your employer can ask you to return to your normal workplace if your original contract specified that you would be office-based or based elsewhere.

In practice, many employers are looking into a blended working model - some time at home - some time in the office/workplace.

You can ask to keep working from home, but that doesn't mean your employer has to agree.

Have an open conversation with your employer about your wishes, and consider making a flexible working request, which is a legal right all employees have.

What to do if you're worried about safety measures at work?

While wearing a mask in an enclosed space will no longer be mandatory, employers will be free to set their own policies requiring workers or customers to wear masks.

our employer has a legal duty under both the law and your contract, to ensure that your workplace does not pose a risk to your health and safety. If you are concerned after speaking to your employer the Health and Safety Executive will provide guidance.

It's all about Communication...

One of the Bevern Trust's values is Care. We ensure that our residents receive high quality care and support which is person-centred, reflecting their needs and wishes. In order to do this, we need to be able to make sure our residents are given the opportunity to make a complaint; good record keeping is essential to enable our non-verbal residents to do this. By making our daily records as detailed and clear as possible we can listen to what the residents tell us in their responses, e.g., body language, facial expressions, vocalisations, body tone. Through audits we can look for patterns in their responses and make changes.

With a detailed account of what the residents are communicating to us day to day we can get a better idea of their general wellbeing and see if they need...

- ... A change in routine
- ... A different activity on their timetable
- ... Extra training for their support staff
- ... A change in communication method e.g., a new way to access their communication grid or a now/next board
- ... Extra assistance from the clinical, physio or communication team

This is part of doing all we can to listen to the residents and provide high quality person-centred care.

Our Summer Challenge fundraising campaign will help us purchase the technology required for this record keeping






