Dear residents of Chailey,

I thought I was one of those people who didn't like surprises, in fact I would have sworn that I didn't, I am pleased that I was wrong, because in my 70th year I have decided that I do like surprises!

The ladies of the parish decided to throw me a surprise 70th birthday lunch in Church and the plotting began. William Hobday a local artist started taking photos of the Rectory and whispering with my wife. My children all called and apologised for not being able to see me on my birth day. Plans, plots, lists appeared everywhere, except where I was and Daisy spent long, thoughtful, snatched time on the computer, writing it transpired, my birthday message. On the day it all came together beautifully, with the service being high jacked by Anthony the treasurer, my children and friends arriving during the first part of the service and seven of my 10 grandchildren meeting for the first time. The gift of the pen and ink drawing of the Rectory by William Hobday is beautiful and the ghostly face appearing at the window is Daisy, smiling because I was well and truly surprised! Thank you everyone for my wonderful surprise.

My second surprise was a few days later, when I found myself in hospital, not for the pre-arranged knee operation but with heart failure which was a real shock. To add to the surprise, my wife and I were speechless to witness, someone visiting the man in the next bed to me in hospital, arriving with a large carrier bag of what we thought was "I'm sorry you are in hospital, here is a treat bag." In fact it was a bag full of runner beans and she proceeded to top, tail and slice all of them for the whole of visiting time.

I am still surprised by that one!

People are often taken unawares by God's power, love and wisdom. The actions of God and Jesus Christ are described as surprising those who witnessed them. Surprise at the sudden appearance of angels, surprise at special births, surprise at the coming of the Holy Spirit, surprise at the circumstances of Jesus Christ's death and resurrection, surprise at the change in peoples lives.

Jesus loves surprises. He loves the fact that if we believe in Him, he can change the course of our lives. Here comes the hard bit. He can stop us in our tracks and alter the path of our lives. You may be faced with the most devastating news. Nothing can immunise you from the shock and the desperate pleading that God might take this from you. And he may. However it might be that you have to find the tools to embrace this unwelcome reality and discover God at the heart of it. Losing control over your life is devastating, yet it was never yours from the moment you surrendered it to God. God is at work in the most desperate of circumstances, you have to seek him out and connect. God will neither fail nor forsake you. Chances are he will surprise you.

02 NETWORK COVERAGE IN CHAILEY

I'm reporting back, as far as Telefonica UK. As promised, I contacted senior management to voice the complaints on behalf of Chailey residents.

The first reply stated that there should be good

coverage, both indoors and outdoors, as there are several masts in the area including 2 masts on the A275, one just north of Chailey and one just south.

Telefonica then went on to say that unfortunately one of the masts wasn't operating at full

capacity at the moment. The engineers have identified that work needs to be carried out on the transmitter. To do this, they need to build an elevated platform, and are currently waiting for the relevant council permits and authority from the land owner – also, new access to the site for the additional equipment.

I was assured that the work will be done as soon as possible.

I followed this up and on September 10th I was informed that the work had still not been completed. It would appear that they are waiting for the permits to be granted.

On behalf of Chailey residents, I shall continue to stress the urgency for these works to be done.

Chailey Horticultural Society

Our Summer Show was held on the 12th Sept. Entries were up and the general standard was as high as usual. Plenty of visitors came and the free apple pressing was as popular as ever

Some committee members have moved away and so we are looking for new faces to join us. If you feel you would like to join us please come to our A.G.M.on the 22nd Oct at 8pm in the Reading Room on Chailey Green.

Summer has well and truly gone but do remember some Summer veg does go on cropping. It is well worth keeping aubergine, peppers and chillies until the end of the month as they can go on fruiting.

Apples are now all ready. If unsure cut one in half and if the seeds are dark brown the fruit is ripe. Only perfect fruit should be stored in a ventilated dark frost free place. Non perfect fruit should be used straight away or made into sauces etc and frozen. Why not invest in an apple press? All the excess and damaged fruit can be made into delicious juice. One Campden tablet per 2 litres will delay fermentation for about 10 days if kept in a fridge. It can also be frozen in a suitable container or converted into cider!

Pears are much more difficult. Different varieties ripen over a long period and if left on the tree often go brown in the centre. It is best to pick them and place them in trays in the light. The 'neck' will just 'give' when ripe but often one is reduced to cutting one to try it! Pears do not do well in an apple press and pear juice and perry making is best left to experts!

Pruning is left 'til after Christmas. Winter veg. next month. Don't forget the A.G.M. Good Gardening
