

But do not forget this one thing, dear friends:

#### Dear friends.

Welcome to the February edition of our Church & Community Magazine. I'm going to begin this month's Lead with a confession! I have had several folk ask me why we have Leap Year this year, and apparently saying "because there is an extra day in February" isn't the right answer, so I've asked some of the guys from NYC to help me write this month's article.

This year, there won't be 365 days as normal, there will be 366. With the extra day tacked on to the end of our shortest month: February. That's right, 2024 is a leap year. The year every "leaper" (anyone born on the 29th of Feb) gets to celebrate their real birthday. Hussar!

But why do we have this extra day that lies in wait for four years before popping up again and how do we decide when to have them?

The answer is a little more complicated than you may think, so here's how it works.

We measure a day as how long it takes the earth to spin once on its own axis, 24 hours. And we measure a calendar year as to how long it takes the earth to orbit the sun, 365 days. Except the time it actually takes for the earth to circle the sun is 365.24 days, so that's roughly 1/4 of a day longer, which adds up to a full day every four years.

To keep everything in sync, this full day is added to the 4th year's shortest month February -and that's what we call a leap year. But we don't actually have a leap year every four years, and here's why!

Remember how we rounded up that nought .24 to 1/4? What that difference does eventually add up to is pushing the whole system out of sync again by three days out of every 400 years. In order to redress the slight imbalance, we have to skip a leap year every now and then so to not add that extra day.

But how do we decide when to have a leap year and when to skip?

The first rule is that the year to add an extra day must be divisible by 4. The second rule is that a leap year cannot fall on a year that's divisible by 100. If it does, no leap day is added to that calendar year, but to make things even more complicated there's an exception to this second rule. If a leap year can be divided by 400 the leap day is added after all, that's why a leap day happened in the 1600 and 2000 but not in 17 hundred 1800 or 1900. We have Pope Gregory the 13th to thank for creating this century rule some 400 years ago. His changes marked the beginning of the Gregorian calendar which is still in use across the world today.

A few interesting reflections about Leap Years

The odds of being born on a leap day are one in 1,461: The 29th of February occurs every four years, or 1,461 days. Therefore, the chances of being born on that day, and earning the title of "leaper" or "leapling", is just one in 1,461.

If you have a fixed annual salary, a leap year means you're working an extra day for free! The bad news is, if we earn an annual salary, we likely don't get paid any extra for a leap year. Therefore, technically, anyone who is at work that day (Thursday this year) is working for free! Traditionally, 29th February is the day woman propose to men.

It's not quite clear when the tradition started, but one theory suggests that Queen Margaret of Scotland, in 1288, aged five, introduced a law allowing women to propose to men on the 29th of February. It is said women wore a red petticoat to make their intentions known. And any man who refused a marriage proposal would be fined a kiss, a silk dress or twelve pairs of gloves!! Thankfully, times have changed. You can get down on one knee any day you like.

So, leap years exist to help us stay in sync with the real astronomical year and if you want to get really precise, there's also the more recent introduction of leap seconds . . .. but maybe I'll try and explain that another year!

I'm going to finish this month's lead with a brilliant question from one of our young people at NYC: "If God knows everything, does everything perfectly and is completely in control of time, why does the calendar need readjusting?"

My answer was far from perfect, but went along something like this:

"Calendars, not just ours but others used throughout history, are our attempt to organize time, but our attempts to organize time or understand the natural world or anything else, will always need to be adjusted because, as God reminded Job, "He was the One who laid the foundations of the earth, determined its measurements, commanded the morning and caused the dawn to know its place." You see for those of us with a faith, that's just the beginning. If you have never read Job 38-41, it's an amazing passage about God's total knowledge and control.

So, I'm going to allow this 29-day month to remind me of my need to depend on, and trust my God, not just one day every few years, but every day.

Please join us for our Lent Course starting on Thursday 22nd February 7pm at St Mary's where we will be thinking about Pilgrimage and journeying with God.

And don't forget! St Peter's Epic Jumble Sale on Saturday 24th February 10am-1pm,

Have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

## **Chailey Cricket Club**

Please note that our Annual Meeting will be held on Friday 8 March 2024. The venue will be the Sports Pavilion at Chailey Sports Club. Start time 19.30 (likely finish time: 20.30). Anyone interested in or looking to join the club is most welcome to attend.

A snippet of club history: at whatever level of cricket is played; be it international, county or club, for a bowler to achieve a hat-trick is a tremendous achievement. To achieve it twice is even more so, but for two bowlers from the same club to achieve their first hat-trick in successive games over the same weekend is a rarity.

Whilst trawling through British Newspaper archives an article was found that reported on that such rarity by two Chailey bowlers. On Saturday 25 August 1962 against Lewes St Michaels, fast bowler Basil Holding achieved a hat-trick in his brilliant figures of 9 for 18. Not to be outdone the very next day in the game against Ardingly, another Chailey bowler: Peter Bentley, with his 'loopy' leg-spin, achieved the same feat in his 7 for 15. Brilliant.

On interrogation of our records there is evidence that from 1949 to date, 14 Chailey bowlers achieved a hat-trick. 3 of those 14 achieved the amazing feat on 2 occasions. Gus Hill, achieved the feat twice in the space of just 7 weeks (June / July 1959) against the same opponent: Danehill. Bet they did not look forward to meeting up with him again! Infact, they did not until 10 years later and yes, he got more wickets, but no hat-trick. The other 2 who achieved the feat twice: Roy Clarkson (1955 and 1958) and Nick Heater (2000 and 2012).

Finally, our fixtures for the forthcoming season are nearing completion. Details of these are on our website.

## **Chailey Commons Society**

As we move into the second month of the year, we can see that the days are slowly getting longer, and we look forward to spring again. The recent record-breaking heavy winter rains have made the commons soggy, and most paths have become muddy trails. Snowfall in early January was better than rain but made everything very messy. Our annual January project of cutting birch for besom broom making took place once again and the resulting bundles have been put into dry storage until October. Thank you to those who joined us and contributed to this interesting and worthwhile heathland activity.

The indoor meetings started again with an interesting talk by Ryan Greaves from the Sussex Bat Group on Bats and Bat Detectors. We will be listening to bats around the commons using our

own bat detector so we can learn more about their sounds and flight.

Our talk this month will be on Thursday 8th February in the Chailey Village Hall at 7.30.p.m. when we have a talk on Nightjars by Greg Conway from the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO). This is a subject of great local interest generally and to those who have joined in the walks on the Chailey commons, usually during June, when these unusual birds visit each year flying over from Africa to spend the summer. Their call is very distinct, being heard after dark, when they feed on moths and pair up for breeding.

New features include recording sightings via email 'sightings'@chaileycommons.org.uk', contact pages, ability to download information and join as members online. A comprehensive activities page should keep everyone informed and this will be updated as required. ## Maria Caulfield Parish news update

2024 has kicked off with the welcome news that households no longer have to pay to get rid of small-scale DIY waste at council recycling centres, boosting recycling and making it easier for people to dispose of their waste in a responsible manner.

The Government has abolished the fees which around one-third of local authorities, including in East Sussex, previously charged to dispose of DIY waste at household waste recycling centres (HWRCs).

All councils in England will now treat DIY waste the same as other household waste when it meets certain conditions, such as not exceeding 2x 50L rubble bags.

This change has the potential to save households hundreds of pounds, with charges that were up to £10 an item, such as a piece of plasterboard, now scrapped.

Today's changes are the latest in a string of reforms to make it simpler and easier to recycle. That includes a consultation launched last week to make it easier to recycle household electrical items and simpler household collection rules announced in October.

Many local residents contacted me regarding these unfair charges and I am glad that the government has listened and acted. This will hopefully reduce the instances of rogue traders collecting DIY waste and then fly-tipping it.

The removal of the fees is part of the wider Government aim to tackle waste crime and fly-tipping, which is estimated to cost the economy £924m per year in England. Among other measures, last year grants totalling £775,000 were annouced to help councils roll out a range of projects to crack down on fly-tipping, with an additional £1m for grants being made available this year.

## **Chailey Horticultural Society**

At last the days are getting appreciably longer and the growing season is nearly upon us Finish pruning apple, pears and quinces by removing any dead, diseased and crossing branches. Try and open up the middle of the tree to let in more sunshine and cut back new growth to keep the tree to a manageable size. Remember you are going to have to pick the fruit!

Stone bearing fruit trees such as plum, damson and apricot should be pruned in May when the sap is rising to reduce the risk of silver leaf fungal infection.

Prune wisteria back to two to three buds on each spur.

Give lawns a good firm rake to remove dead grass and as much moss as possible.

Continue to remove yellow leaves from brassicas and clear out diseased and rotten stems in the chard.

February can be a very cold month and with the ground saturated from autumn rains planting outside is not a good idea. What is needed is a good propagator and a warm, light conservatory or greenhouse because now is a good time to plant chillies and aubergine seeds. Both require a long growing season so an early start is essential. With chillies find a variety that suits you and save the seed. With aubergine a good standard is money maker. For greenhouse tomatoes now is the time to sow seeds. Shirley is probably the best of the medium sized tomatoes although Alicante and Money Maker are old favourites. For salad tomatoes go for Sungold and Gardeners Delight. The alternative is to buy in plug plants in late March or April if only a few plants are required. There is also the option of grafted plants. These are traditional varieties grafted onto disease resistant and more vigorous root stock. They undoubtedly produce strong vigorous plants and a bigger crop but I do wonder if the taste is compromised by the use of a different root stock.

For beefsteak varieties always buy in. As they can only really be grown in a greenhouse in our climate I tend to only grow one or two standard tomatoes and use the rest of the space for beefsteak types such as Buffalo Steak and Super Steak. After all blight resistant outside tomatoes can make up the bulk of the crop - more next month.

If you have a heated greenhouse it is possible to get an early crop of strawberries by bringing them inside in containers. Strawberries need a cold spell so the end of February is early enough. Remove all the dead leaves and give them a good feed with tomorite.

At the end of the month I have my first sacks of Swift potatoes in the greenhouse along-side onion sets started of in modules. Stick to old varieties such as Sturon , Stuttgarter Giant ( best for keeping) and Red Baron.

Best of all is Douce Provence peas started off in pots.

Is there anything better than fresh peas and new potatoes? Patience!

Our schedules are now available from committee members and The Five Bells. Our Spring Show is on Saturday 23rd March when we will be giving out buckets and seed potatoes for the childrens potatoes in a bucket competition.

#### **Lent Course 2024**

'Come Follow me'.

The season of Lent begins on February 14th this year. Lent highlights the time Jesus spent in the desert where he went to discern his vocation to be obedient to God and reject the devil's temptations. The Lenten season is a time when Christians are encouraged to spend time examining their own relationship with God. This year the parishes of Newick and Chailey will again combine to journey together on both our individual and collective journeys.


