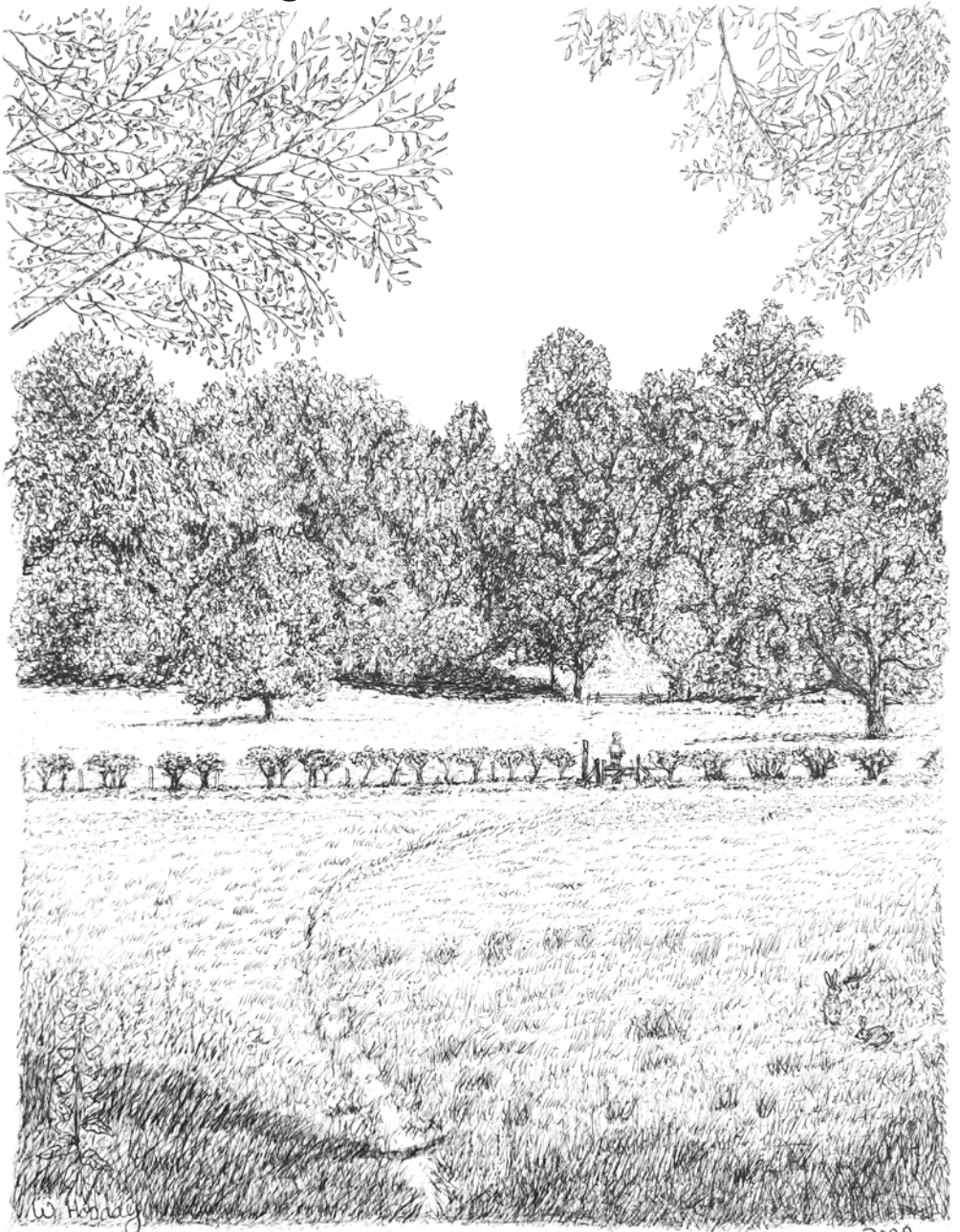

Dear friends,

How do we understand the mysteries of God? Who is God?
What is God up to?

If Jesus's disciples who were with Him daily for years had
trouble understanding Him, what expectation is there that

you and I will?

We may see glimpses of God – through new life, through nature, in creativity, music and dance and so on – but none of us truly sees every part of God. St Paul himself wrote that “now we see through a glass darkly”.

So how do we try to express the grandeur of God? In the Old Testament, Isaiah 6:1, the prophet wrote, ‘In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of His robe filled the temple.’

I love that picture, it makes me think of brides on their wedding day who have a full skirt and train, and the help they need from their bridesmaids just to get in and out of the wedding car let alone anything else they need to do.

Architects and builders over the centuries have used the church building to illustrate aspects of God and to share their faith.

We have two stunning examples in our local churches of St Mary's Newick and St Peter's Chaiey, the doors are open during the day so please come & see, spend some time within these prayer soaked walls which have held and supported our communities for millenia and will hopefully continue to do so in the future.

For many of you July is the season for summer holidays, travelling around the Uk or going abroad. If you are able, why not visit a large church building or cathedral and spend some time there when there is no service taking place.

As you go into the building, quickly stop and just look around you. ‘Feel’ the space surrounding and above you. The distance between you and the ceiling or roof.

Stop for a while in the area where the congregation sit – the nave – taken from the Latin word *navis* meaning ‘ship’. This is because when they were built, largely in the Middle Ages, the people thought a nave looked like the bottom part of a ship turned upside-down. This reminded them also of the story of God saving His creation at the time of the flood by using the Ark.

What does this space say to you about the mysteries of God?

If it leaves you with questions, please be in touch.

From the Parish leaflet - July 1922

July 26th One Sunday afternoon in September last there sprang into being in the mind of Mr W. Bristow a very happy thought soon translated into words. He delved into the memories of a generation and more and recalled the splendours of the Chailey Horticultural Society of his youth. And like a wise man he looked back to look forward, saying to himself, 'Why not resuscitate the past? Why not span the gulf of some 30 years and suffer the Chailey Horticultural Society to live again?' Thus he arranged a meeting of like minded souls resulting in our show on the 26th.

Naturally this first show was on a small scale but the quality of the exhibits was good and there was keen competition which augurs well for the future. The attendance numbering about 500 was cheering and there were some 200 exhibits.

The prizes were distributed by Mrs Blencowe at 5.00 and later in the evening the exhibits were sold by Dutch auction on behalf of the Society.

Note: The Chailey Horticultural Society is still going strong. Their Summer Show is on 16th July followed by an Autumn Show on 10th September.

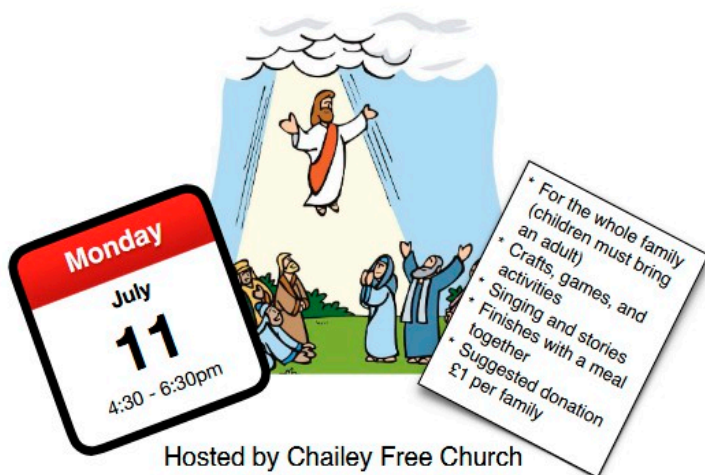

Chailey Speedwatch Group needs your help.

We are writing as the co-ordinators for Chailey Speedwatch to ask those living in the village if they wish it to continue, and if so, are you prepared to give as little as 90 minutes of your time per month in order that it can?

Speedwatch was restarted in Chailey on 15th June 2020 and since that time has been run by a small and diminishing number of volunteers. The lower number means a reduced number of sessions that we are able to hold, and the group will not be viable beyond the end of August unless new volunteers join.

Speedwatch serves two purposes:

To be a visible presence in the village, our being present has the effect of slowing traffic by reminding drivers to check their speed and drive within the limit.

The second being to report those drivers that exceed the limit by an amount which police have set.

We have 4 sites approved for use by the police. (1.North Chailey - traffic heading into Chailey. 2.Chailey – traffic heading to Lewes. 3. South Chailey – traffic heading to Lewes and 4.South Chailey – traffic heading to Haywards Heath)

Since January this year we have run 19 sessions, during 6, no drivers exceeded the reportable speed.

In the other 13 sessions there were 76 reportable cases of speeding, the highest being 57mph. (The highest since we recommenced in June 2020 being 69mph).

One of the biggest issues I get from almost every village is the problems caused by noisy vehicles and motorbikes. I am not talking about ordinary cars travelling from A to B but those who deliberately use our villages and country lanes as racetracks or an open road to speed. This seems to have got increasingly worse over lockdown in almost every part of the constituency.

Recently noise cameras have been developed and used by the Department for Transport as Roadside Vehicle Noise Measurements and the Department is trialing these to see how effective they could be as a deterrent. Like speed cameras they will record a vehicles detail if it triggers the camera at a certain noise level. Each MP can bid for one site in their constituency but only four will be chosen across the country in the initial pilot.

I am working with the MP for Eastbourne and we have put in a joint bid to the Department for Transport for the new noise cameras to be installed on Beachy Head Road and Birling Gap Road at East Dean which link the two constituencies and are used by both souped up cars and motorbikes as a race track.

Should the pilot be successful I am keen to bid for more cameras for the constituency and I would be keen to hear from parishes about the areas where these would make the greatest difference. Chailey Commons Society

The dry weather continued through May and into June, broken occasionally by short sharp storms with associated heavy rain, but overall, the ground is still very dry.

Our meetings continued with a well-supported early summer walk on Lane End Common, when we were able to see the fungus called 'Chicken of the Woods' *Laetiporus sulphureus*. Chicken of the woods is found growing on or at the base of dead or dying hardwood trees - most commonly on oak. We also saw the 'Twayblade' orchid *Neottia ovata*. Which is a medium-sized orchid that can be easily overlooked despite being one of our commonest species. Common in the woodlands and scrub, its flower spike carries a very loose cluster of yellow-green flowers that are not as showy as some of the other more exotic-looking orchids. Once again, the large piles making up the nests and colonies of the wood ant were much in evidence. After the walk we were invited to have tea and cakes in the fantastic and pretty garden of one of our members and donations were made towards a new Bat Detector. Thank you to our hosts Lee and Marcel for providing such an amazing venue.

We were able to do our annual late evening walk to seek out the nightjars. We were lucky in as much as they were heard but remained elusive as usual. An added bonus were four glow-worms on the playing field at Memorial Common.

We will be having our outing on Saturday July 16th when we hope to visit some commons in the Lower Thames Basin, and we should be able to see the areas around Guildford such as Wisley and Chobham commons. We have asked for a local ranger to guide us. Details on the website or in the information sheets circulated to members.

Also in July we will be doing a summer butterfly walk and count when we will look out for and

record as many species as we can. Meet at Lane End Car Park on Saturday July 23rd at 2.p.m. The Exmoor ponies continue to do a good job of grazing and are looking fit and well. Please can we ask that dogs are not to use the drinking troughs as a plunge pool and are kept under control. A Plea from Your Parish Church

What does £1 buy?

Not very much, as we all know. £1 is less than the cost of a cup of branded take-away coffee or tea, a loaf of branded bread, a box of cereal, a scoop of ice-cream.....

St Peter's Church, which has stood in Chailey for nearly 800 years, really needs some more of those £1s. We expect you are probably saying: 'Oh, no! Here goes the Church again, asking for yet more money', and believe us, we really hate to ask! But please, read on.....

Even if you are not a regular churchgoer, you might have attended a baptism, wedding or funeral, joined in with a social, or other, event, or just appreciate the fact that the church is there for everyone in the parish who needs it. You may even appreciate it just for its heritage and historical significance. The truth is, unless more people than just those on the church's membership roll donate, even just a few pounds a year, St Peter's will not be here for future generations. 'The Church of England' does not support St Peter's. As well as covering all the costs of maintaining the building and the churchyard, St Peter's must pay its way to the Diocese, to help cover Diocesan clergy wages and pensions, housing and many other expenses. At present, St Peter's church members cannot pay the Diocese what we are supposed to pay; we are being allowed to under-pay for a while. If this goes on, St Peter's Church days will be numbered. Will ours be the generation that allows this 12th Century church to cease to exist?

We know that not everyone can afford to give, and of course, a big 'thank you' goes to those who do already. But, if even 1000 of the 1300 plus households in the village were able to donate just £1.00 per month, that would be £12,000 per year, which would completely turn the situation around to put us in credit with the Diocese.

Chailey Horticultural Society

Please remember our Summer Show at the Village Hall on Saturday 16th July. Entry forms must be submitted by 8pm on the Friday night and exhibits staged between 8am and 10.30am on the Saturday morning. Doors open at 2.30pm in the afternoon and the prize giving is at 4pm. Also we will be judging the potatoes in a bucket competition. Please could the buckets for judging be brought to the Village Hall by 11am.

Now to matters horticultural. July is a month of grand abundance in the vegetable garden as all

the hard work of previous months produces results. First and second early potatoes will be being dug. The space vacated is the ideal spot to grow leeks. Give the earth a good going over with a hoe to disrupt any weeds. The leeks to be transplanted should be about pencil size. Make a hole with a dibber to such a depth that only the top couple of inches of the leek protrudes above ground level and then water in. It is often suggested to trim the roots before planting but I think this is unnecessary.

Most traditional strawberry plants will be coming to the end of their fruiting season and producing runners. If no new plants are required remove these as they appear. However to propagate new plants allow one runner per plant and one plant per runner. Encourage the new plant to root and when firmly established cut it free and pot it up.

Spring sown broad beans will be in full growth and will be in danger from black fly. One way to reduce the risk is to pinch out the growing tip as soon as the bottom flowers have set and use this as a spinach substitute.

Runner beans will be reaching the top of their poles and the growing tip can be pinched out to encourage more side shoots and flowering. Old fashioned varieties such as scarlet emperor and enorma may have difficulty setting. Ensure plenty of moisture and a gentle misting in the evening may help. Newer varieties such as moonlight and snowstorm which are crosses between French and runner beans do not have this problem. However the flowers are a tasty snack for sparrows. When picking it is a good idea to use a small pair of scissors to avoid pulling on the stalk. Pick when young and before the shape of the bean can be seen. Surplus beans freeze well but also make delicious runner bean chutney. Recipe available on request!

Make a final summer sowing of lettuce, spring onion and beetroot. I also start off chard in modules to be planted out in early autumn to ensure a good supply over winter and next spring and summer. All white varieties such as white silver over winter better than rainbow varieties.

Ensure greenhouse crops are well watered and watch out for red spider mite which particularly attacks aubergines and cucumbers. Increasing humidity by wetting surfaces and paths will help reduce the risk.

Our next meeting on Tuesday 5th July will be Members' Night, when the Committee have an evening off and the programme is in the hands of the members. Because of this we cannot divulge the speaker!

was approached by the programme planners who had seen his website which mentioned he did repairs, just what they wanted to hear. Our questions went on coming and we could have gone on for a long time in what was one of our most entertaining evenings. We meet in the Village Hall on the first Tuesday of each month at 7.30 pm. We are always glad to welcome prospective members or guests, who for the nominal sum of £3 can enjoy listening to our speaker and enjoy delicious home made refreshments.

Chailey Deer

The local Fallow and Roe deer does will have been having their fawns in late May and June. Deer leave their fawns alone in cover as a defence strategy while the doe moves away to feed and gain sufficient nourishment to produce milk for their young. The fawns are well camouflaged and have no scent, so predators can't easily find them. If you find a lone deer fawn in cover, just leave it there. The doe won't be far away.

Fallow deer have now become so abundant in our area, that they are now identified as a pest species by some government agencies. An adult fallow deer needs to consume approximately 9 to 12lbs of food a day and as they are a herding species a herd of fallow can cause significant damage to forests, crop fields or domestic gardens. There are more deer in the UK than ever before, and as they have no natural predators, their numbers just continue to grow. So how can you control them?

Barrier methods, such as mesh fencing are effective for smaller plots of land. However, to keep Roe deer out the fence needs to be 1.2 meters or 48 inches, and for Fallow 2 meters or 78 inches high. Fencing can also be expensive to erect and maintain. Alternatively, deer numbers can be reduced through culling. Just to maintain the current number of deer 30% of the herd needs to be culled each year. Less than 30% and their numbers will continue to rise.

If you decide that you need to cull the deer on your land, how do you go about it? You need to find a deer stalker, but you also need to check that they are competent and trustworthy first. A deer stalker should always have two priorities: Public safety and animal welfare. You should check their firearms certificate to see if they have a deer legal rifle and that they have the 'condition' that allows them to shoot deer legally. You should also check that they have public liability insurance for up to £10m. Additionally, you should ask them if they have a deer stalking certificate one (DSC1). This qualification will demonstrate that they are knowledgeable about deer species, anatomy, ecology, habitat, legal issues, and that they can shoot straight. You could ask them if they have a deer stalking certificate two (DSC2), which will show an additional level of competency and the ability to put culled deer into the human food chain. Furthermore, you could ask them if they have the deer management qualification. Finally, as a landowner and the owner of the stalking rights to the land, you need to give the deer stalker written and signed permission to stalk on your land. Annual Parish Meeting Held on 10th May 2022

This latter closure will move forward to allow access via Cinder Hill once the Procession has cleared.

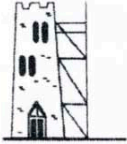

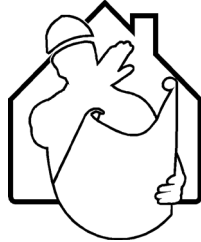
