"Peace In The Storm"

As you are aware my wife who has written all of the previous articles in the magazine is unwell and at the moment unable to continue to write them, so I now have to take that

responsibility.

In a sermon I preached recently I spoke about Jesus taking Peter, James and John up to a mountain top where Jesus was transfigured, his clothes became dazzling white and Moses and Elijah appeared before him. A cloud enveloped them, and a voice came from the cloud saying, "This is, my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!" It was a WOW moment, it showed Jesus's divine nature and was a glimpse of the resurrection. Peter although frightened wanted to build three booths and stay in the moment, but it did not last and they came back down the mountain, back to reality. Mountain top experiences are great and can be exciting and memorable, but they do not last and in reality we have to spend most of our lives in the valley. It is in the valley that we face the daily trial and tribulations of life, the hardships, the worries and the fears and it is in these times that we sometimes do not know where to turn for help, so here are three things that can help us through the storms of life.

- 3 Things God gives us for peace in our storms
- 1. His Word ... It is the Word of the Living God that guides and instructs us when storms arise. The scriptures are full of promises of peace. God's Word promises us that He will keep us in "perfect peace" when we trust in Him "for in the Lord Jehovah is everlasting strength" (Isaiah 26:3-4). It also tells us that when we dwell in God's "secret place," we can be assured of His protection and deliverance; having no reason to fear (Psalm 91)-now that's what I call peaceful assurance!
- 2. His Spirit. The Spirit of the Lord is called by many names in the Bible. One of the names He is called is "Comforter." This term-although in today's vernacular, is relative to something you use to keep you warm-can better be used as "Advocate". An advocate is one that helps us, and even argues on our behalf.

The Holy Spirit is given to advocate for us! Jesus told His disciples that He would not leave them "comfortless" when He leaves, but give them "another Comforter" to live with them (us) forever (John 14:16,18). It is the ministry of the Holy Spirit to be the representative of Jesus-abiding in us.

It is through His ministry that we can be calm in the storms of life. Like Jesus, we can experience rest or peace when all hell is breaking-lose all around us!

Does God intend for us to be caught up in the turmoil of the storm or to tell the storm to be still and quiet down?

Our example, Jesus, was resting in the midst of a storm and probably would not have gotten up; were it not for the fright of the disciples-who should have commanded the storm to cease. They failed to remember His word "let us pass over unto the other side." (Mark 4:35).

That word should have carried them from their starting place, through whatever storms may arise, on to their destination. But they cried out for fear! What has the Lord told you that you have allowed the storms of life to speak louder than God's Word-worse yet-or make you forget it?

3. Each Other. The final point I want to make is: God also, uses us to help each other make it through difficult times-He expects us to help one another.

Jesus' life and teachings exemplified this. Whether it was when He healed the sick, raised the dead, cast out devils, fed the multitudes, or taught; I.e., the "four friends" that brought the man to Jesus by letting him down through the roof (Mark 2:3-5); or the "good Samaritan" who found a man beaten and left in a ditch, and took care of his needs (Luke 10:30-37); He commands us to "go and do likewise." (Luke 10:37).

It is our responsibility and privilege to help calm the storms in each other lives as much as we are able. Maybe, all you can do is pray-then pray and stand in faith that God will send the help needed.

Do what you can and God will do what you cannot!

Sometimes when all you have is God, then that is all you need.

There have been two incidents of reported deer poaching on the commons and this is illegal. Should anyone come across this taking place, the first action should be to call 999, or if discovered after the event a report should be made to the police number 101. The shooting of the gun and the illegal hunting / poaching are both criminal offences. Hunting / poaching being in direct contravention of the stipulated Lewes DC byelaw 11(1).

Our next indoor meeting will be our AGM in the Chailey Village Hall on Thursday March 8th at 7.30.p.m. After the formal business there will be news of our surveys and findings on both Lane End Common and Markstakes Common. Tamara Lempicka Art Deco and the Roaring Twenties HARRY FLETCHER

Tamara Lempicka was a Russian born Polish painter who spent her working life in France and the United States. She is best known for her polished portraits of aristocrats and the wealthy and for her highly stylized paintings of nudes. Her private life was as colourful as her paintings.

Fleeing the Russian Revolution with her first husband she lived in Paris where she quickly became one of the best-known painters of the Art Deco style. After divorcing him she had several love affairs before meeting her second husband Baron Kuffner when he commissioned her to paint a portrait of one of his mistresses, needless to say she did the most unflattering likeness.

At the outbreak of the second world war she and the Baron moved to America where she continued to work with great success, she once said that her secret was 'Never copy, create a new style with luminous and brilliant colours and rediscover elegance.'

Chailey And District Horticultural Society

Traditionally March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb. However over recent years I feel there has been a shift to more cold weather in February and March. At least the days are lengthening and the sun has more warmth so lots of planting to do.

Towards the end of the month plant onion sets. Make a small hole in which to place the bulb with the top just visible. Do not push the bulb into the ground as this may damage the growing plate from which the roots appear. Plant them 6" apart and shorten the top to try and deter the birds from pulling them out. Good varieties are Sturon , Stuttgarten giant and Red Baron.

At the end of the month plant first early potatoes. The easiest way to do this is to make a hole 6" to 8" deep and line it with rotting leaves. Place the seed potato shoots uppermost and cover. The point of the rotting leaves is to provide a slightly acid environment to prevent scab. Check regularly for the appearance of growth above ground and earth up for frost protection.

Early peas can be sown directly if not troubled by mice and Feltham First is a good all rounder. In the greenhouse flowering annuals , celeriac , celery , leeks , summer brassicas and lettuce. Parsnips and carrot are best sown in early April.

Shorten summer fruiting raspberries to 6ft and ensure they are well tied in.

Unlike most bulbs snowdrops are divided and moved as soon as they have finished flowering and are still green.

The grass will be starting to grow and so a top dressing and soil aeration with a fine fork is a good idea. Use grass seed on any thin or bare patches.

Group Litter Pick: Tuesday 27th March. Meet at North Chailey Sports Ground car park at 10am for a couple of hours litter picking. Please wear appropriate footwear and bring high vis vest, gloves and a grabber if you have them. Some equipment is available on the day as well as plenty of bags. Come along and be part of keeping Chailey beautiful. Greenpeace are campaigning on the issue of plastic bottles, easily the most frequent piece of litter we pick up. They have been lobbying Coca-Cola, the biggest soft drinks producer in the world, who churn out billions of single use plastic bottles every year. Coca-Cola have now come out in support of deposit return schemes in the UK, as well as launching a refill trial at Reading University and agreeing to increase the amount of

recycled content in their bottle worldwide. All these are steps in the right direction to tackling the issue of plastic. Both deposit return and refill schemes would help reduce littering too.

Are you upset by the littering of our oceans and countryside with plastic? It's not just bottles, but food containers, the plastic film used in coffee cups, lids, drinking straws, bags and so the list goes on. Could you reduce the amount of single use plastic in your shopping bag? People power works; refuse to buy things wrapped in unnecessary plastic and retailers will stop producing them.

The above appeal was held at Newick Village Hall and was well attended by local residents, in particular, those living at New Heritage Way and

our Chailey Parish Council Chairman who spoke in opposition to this development. The appeal carried onto a fourth day when the Closing Submissions and Statement were presented on behalf of the appellant and Lewes District Council. My submission was one of support for the District and our Parish Council. The Inspector will make the final decision in the months ahead.

Celebrating the original plastic free milk home service and supporting the great british tradition – the milkman – glass making a comeback

I have on a number of occasions in the past championed the service our milkman gives us in our rural community and, indeed, throughout the country. Many have laughed at my support, but the times – they are a-changing. In 1860, with the advent of the new railway network, milk could be delivered direct to our homes and in the 1950's, the horse-drawn method was taken overtaken by the electric 3-wheeled vehicle In 1975, 94 per cent of milk was put into glass bottles, but that has fallen to under three per cent by 2016. Now, only 13% of milk is delivered by a milkman. The traditional glass milk bottle is the historical recycling container as it can be washed and used up to 25 times and delivery is free.

The negative, is, of course - supermarkets are cheaper and if life is tough and money is short, there is no doubt that the priority is getting the best value for your money and the milkman cannot compete on price. Some Chailey residents have told me that they leave so early, that the milk will go off on the doorstep. Cool For Life Bags keep the milk fresh for around 8 hours). Jim, our milkman gets up just after 12.00 midnight and frequently delivers to members of our community that are lonely and seeing a friendly face can make such a difference to their lives.

It's more expensive for our Dairy farmers who are producing milk without chemicals and care for their animals, rather than the factory-farmed cows who have a miserable existence. We have Fair Trade for bananas and coffee – it makes sense to reward our small farmers who offer better welfare and a better product – a Fair Trade for our UK farmers

Lastly, our local milk service will be using electric vehicles in 2018, so we have completed the circle. Eco-friendly glass bottles and re-introducing electric vehicles many remember fondly in the 1950's and on a lighter note, perhaps some older residents might remember the Benny Hill record – Ernie the fastest milkman in the West!

100% Bursaries For Talented Children




