

Chailey Commons Society

Having had one of the wettest months on record in March it has been so welcome to feel the warm sun and the ceasing of the penetrating cold east wind.

Our Annual General Meeting took place in March with the annual election of officers and committee members completed and a new member joining as Schools Link Officer. New members are aways welcome so, if you would like to join us, come along to our activities, and find out more.

The four Exmoor ponies have come through the winter in good condition and their new coats are beginning to look rich and bright in the spring sunshine. They are still busy feeding on gorse and bramble as well as the heathland grasses. They are checked each day and have all they need, so please do not be tempted to feed them. Not only is this bad for their health but also encourages greedy behaviour with the risk of a dog or person getting hurt. As usual enjoy from a distance!

Wildlife refuges: we have set out some advisory refuge boundaries, with one again on Red House Common and two new ones on Memorial Common. We always recognise that some of our heathland areas are known to be important for ground nesting birds such as Nightjar, and these can be disturbed by walkers and dogs off the main paths. Please look out for any wildlife refuge areas marked out between March and July. Public rights of way will not be affected, and fortunately, there are many established paths across the commons. Your help will be appreciated.

Planning: we have provided evidence in opposition to the siting of a 5G telecommunications mast on open grazed common land within the Local Nature Reserve at Beggars Wood Road. Our preparations also continue for the Public Hearing on 6th June examining the proposal to install substations on Beggars Wood Road and near Plum Tree crossroads, which will affect landscape and wildlife value of the Commons. Chailey's Community Harvest Flower Festival!

Some readers might remember the excitement of our Christmas Tree Festival in the past. We had thought of having another one, but with those at Cuckfield, Uckfield and Newick so well established it might be 'gilding the lily'.

So, it has been over a decade plus, since we have held a Flower Festival in our Medieval Church, it must be time for another!

Over our harvest weekend, 6th to 8th October we are planning a Community Harvest Flower Festival. Similar to the Christmas Tree festival, we shall be writing to all of our local groups and businesses, to invite them to participate in the Festival. The church has been surveyed and floral displays space has been identified.

We would then offer the space to be filled by a floral display, representing harvest and the group or organisation.

This can be undertaken in either of 3 ways: -

- 1) The group/organisation can arrange a display Friday Morning in situ.
- 2) The group/organisation can bring a pre-arranged display to fill the allocated space.
- 3) The group/organisation can donate towards the cost of flowers, and an arrangement will be undertaken on their behalf by our church flower ladies. The cost will vary according to the size of the floral display.

Chailey Cricket Club

By the time you read this we will have started our 2023 season. Hopefully the weather has been kind to us and all other cricket clubs. Unlike in 1953 we will not have celebrities playing for us.... from Sussex Daily News of 25 September 1953 – 'Famous county cricketing brothers John and James Langridge are playing tomorrow to help in the restoration of a Sussex church. They are included in the Chailey rector's and churchwardens' team, who will meet Chailey Cricket Club on the Chailey ground [Roeheath] at 2 p.m.'

Looking at our scorebook records the Chailey team: Alf Holding, Bill Dudman, Bill Buckman, Percy Gilbert, Colin Foord, Bob Bentley, B & J Page, Malcolm Ewens, H Graham and Wing-Co Braithwaite [later the club umpire who sat on a shooting stick whilst umpiring] were dismissed for 56....40 short of the opposition

John Langridge later appeared in 1983, this time at North Common at the invitation of the then president of Chailey Sport Club, Maj-Gen Phil Tillard CBE, to open the extension of the Sports pavilion.

Today, although we have no celebrities, we have a tremendous group of players whose ages span around 50 years! All thoroughly enjoy the very friendly, yet competitive, way in which we play our games.

Our 2023 Annual Meeting attended by 11 members (11 other members sent their apologies for not being able to attend) was held at The Five Bells on 31 March. The main points that came out of that meeting:

 The Chair (David Dembrey) felt that season 2022 was yet another very good season with games played in great sportsmanship

The Treasurer (Peter Dembrey) confirmed that although funds look good the forthcoming

season will drain much of that through upkeep of square and preparing wickets, mower maintenance and purchase of other necessities for the season. To counter this he proposed an increase in the subscription for adult players, non-players and vice-presidents to £40 per year. Match fees to remain at £10. Juniors to pay half the rates.

However, it was agreed we do need to raise money via other sources to ensure the long-term viability of the club.

- The Fixtures secretary (Marc Sellis) confirmed that fixtures had been arranged for every Sunday from 7 May through to and including 24 September. All matches are listed on our website - see below.
- Groundsfolk preparation will start as soon as the weather permits. Volunteers to help the pre/ early season would be welcomed.
- All agreed that despite having a great group of players the club does need to recruit more. Agreed to seek players. [Anyone wanting to play, umpire or score – does not have to be every game - please ring Peter on 07709 946880)

Chailey Horticultural Society

We had a very pleasant Spring Show at the village hall on the 25th of March despite weeks of cold and wet with a wind which was particularly damaging to the daffodils.

Our next event is the plant sale on 13th May in the village hall car park between 10am and midday.

Now to matters horticultural. Late April and May can be a challenging time due to the uncertainties of the weather and particularly night time temperatures and the danger of a frost. It is therefore wise to delay planting out frost tender plants such as tomatoes, sweetcorn and squash until early June and don't forget to earth up early potatoes for their protection.

By May the greenhouse is usually frost immune but try and keep temperatures down during the

day by good ventilation and ensure maximum light to avoid plants going leggy.

Don't plant tomatoes in the greenhouse borders until the first flower truss is opening. Plant as deep as possible even up to the first proper leaves and ensure the receiving hole is well watered.

May and June are the months in which to prune stone bearing fruit trees such as plums, apricots

and damsons as the sap is rising which reduces the risk of introducing silver leaf.

One crop really worth growing in the vegetable plot is sweet corn since this enables the cob to be cooked straight after being harvested. The value of this is as soon as the cob is picked it starts turning sugars into starch reducing the sweetness and giving it a mealy consistency. Sow in doors in late April and choose a modern 'extra tendersweet' variety such as Swift F1 which is also quick maturing. Follow this with Goldcrest. As they are wind pollinated plant in blocks and do not mix varieties as this may result in poor flavour. Traditionally in the Americas where maize originated it was usual to plant squash at the base to cover the ground and help retain moisture and of course gather another crop. I have tried this with ridge cucumbers with mixed results! Prepare the ground for your winter brassicas with plenty of well rotted manure and some added

lime. As previously mentioned plan what you need and go for plug plants.

Sow another row of chard to ensure a supply through the winter and go for the traditional white stemmed varieties as they do better in the cold than coloured types.

Keep an eye on the leak seedlings to ensure they are ready to take the place of the first early potatoes If adding grass cuttings to the compost heap remember to add some old newspapers and cardboard to stop it getting too soggy.

Maria Caulfield MP - Reducing Sewage Outflows

I just wanted to update on the work locally to improve the quality of our waters both inshore and coastal. Last week, as a group of Sussex MPs, we met with the Chief Exec of Southern Water to discuss sewage discharges into Sussex rivers and oceans.

These overflows, which discharge out to sea when our sewage system is at capacity, have been in place since Victorian times and it is only recently, since the Government introduced new laws to monitor their use, that we all realise how often they are used.

Most of the sewage discharge systems locally are a dual system, meaning they collect both sewage and rainfall. It is the rainfall element that causes the system to fill up, with sewage being only a tiny percent. Sewage on its own would rarely cause the need for overflows to be used. With the heavy amount of rainfall in recent days we have seen more discharges than usual.

While the Government has produced the £56 billion Storm Overflows Discharge Reduction Plan, with work starting immediately to decouple it from rainfall collection, this will take time. In the meantime, there are steps we can all take to help reduce the amount of rainfall entering the overflow system and thereby reduce the number of times systems reach capacity and discharges happen. From retaining grass soakaways on properties to the use of water butts and not flushing wet wipes that clog up our drains all helps to ensure our sewage system can cope with rainfall so that outflows remain limited. In the Isle of Wight, a recent campaign which encourages the public to help reduce rainfall entering the sewage system saw a 80% reduction in the use of storm overflows.

Southern Water told us at our meeting, that work to decouple to sewage system from rainfall will start imminently and will involve digging up every road across Sussex to replace the dual system we currently have. Water companies are investing £3.1 billion to deliver the 800 storm overflow improvements across England by 2025 and in the meantime, Ministers have taken forward plans to lift the Environment Agency's maximum civil fine for individual breaches of the rules. Fines for water companies who seriously breach rules will be increased 1,000-fold, from £250,000 to up to £250 million. Meanwhile to reassure residents and visitors our coastal waters in the area from Seaford to Birling Gap remain rated as "Excellent" by the Environment Agency.

One Hundred and more Years Ago

May 1913

The Red Cross in Sussex. Annual Inspection held in the newly erected Parish Room, Chailey. The Parish Room was converted into quite a delightful little hospital. It was all very realistic make believe but the work of the staff was of course undertaken as if the unreality was altogether absent. The main building was divided into two wards for the treatment of surgical and medical cases, various supposed fractures, bullet wounds etc., being treated in the former, and diseases, such as rheumatic fever and pneumonia, in the latter. In addition there was also an isolation hospital, an operating theatre, a milk room, kitchen, and campfires, constructed

with earth work, grease refuse pots etc., the principle idea of improvisation underlying the whole scheme. No detail was left out in carrying out the representation.

The members of staff on duty were: Dr Orton (Medical Officer), Miss Cotesworth (Commandant) and Mrs J Blencowe (Quartermaster). The room was thrown open to the public later in the day and a number availed themselves of the opportunity of becoming acquainted with the useful work of the Detachment. The Newick and Chailey Boy Scouts were very useful on this occasion.

Note: Sounds like a wonderful day for everyone! Little did the participants realise how soon their skills were going to be called on for real in 1914.

It seems unbelievable that Chailey Repair Care most open long ago as August 2018. Since then we have tackled nearly 4000 repairs (yes, we count them!) Our 35 skilled volunteers will take an almost anything requiring attention (but not microwaves

or fridges - sorry!) and as many as 160 people now come along each month.

Amongst the 80 repairs we took on last month were a sewing machine, clothes airer, antique lamp, much loved teddy bear, vintage cine projector, and a wooden rabbit - we do love a challenge!!! Don't forget that can also sharpen your garden tools and kitchen knives....

Chailey Repair Café is part of a world-wide movement where volunteer experts repair things free of charge - although a donation towards running costs is invited. Anyone can bring along broken items or clothing needing repair from home, and have a cuppa and a cake and then watch while your repair is done in front of you.

You'll find us at St Peter's Church, Chailey on the A275 at Chailey Green normally on the second Saturday of each month (13 May, 10 June and so on) between 1000hrs and 1300hrs where we have a full Café service including our legendary cakes!

But – we are now getting very busy and, as a result, you may have to wait for a while before we can tackle your repair. We don't offer a drop off service, so please be patient - remember that we've given up our Saturday (and lots more time behind the scenes!) to provide this service for vou all in the community.

Citizens Advice

Can my employer really make me work on a public holiday, and should I get paid extra if I do?

Unfortunately, when it comes to bank holidays, whether or not staff have to work is up to their employer, and you don't have to be paid more if you do. It may depend on a number of factors such as whether your place of work is open on bank holidays, your hours of work and crucially, what your contract says. If your place of work is normally open on a bank holiday you'll probably be asked to work at least some. But if your contract says you get bank holidays off you shouldn't be asked to work.

A common misunderstanding around bank holidays is that employers have to pay you extra for working them. This is not the case. Unless your contract says you'll be paid extra you will just be paid your normal amount.

If your contract says you are entitled to bank holidays but you're asked to work, you should be able to take a different day off in lieu.

If you don't have a contract, the legal default position is that your employer can tell you when you can or can't take time off.

If you find you need to resolve an issue with your employer, first ask for an informal chat, where you can raise your concerns.


