Dear friends,

Welcome to the September edition of our Church & Community Magazine. I hope you've had a good summer so far, albeit one with mixed blessings of weather!

This first Sunday of September we will be having a blessing of a different kind, as we invite our young people to come to the 10am Service at both St Peter's & St Mary's bringing with them their new school bags for the start of term to receive a blessing for the new school year.

So, if you have a new school backpack, or office and work laptop bag come along on Sunday 2nd September at 10 o'clock and we can bless you on your journey.

This is also the time of year for many schools and churches to hold their Harvest Festival services. This will be the case for our primary schools, but for us as rural churches we recognise that September is still usually a bit early for are farmers, therefore our Harvest Services will be on 8th October at St Peter's Chailey and 15th October at St Mary's Newick and we would love it if you could join us next month.

September is the time for our amazing Horticultural shows and Newick Horticultural Society Annual Show and Dog show will be on Saturday 2nd September and Chailey & District Horticultural Society Autumn Show will be on the 9th of September.

No doubt, there will be displays of food, some grown in local gardens and plenty of CAKE!!!

While most gardeners have pleasure growing fruit and vegetables, it can be hard work tending to them, and this year has been more challenging than most!

God is often described as the constant gardener and Jesus talked a lot about the care given to vines. In John 15:1-8 Jesus compared Himself to a vine and referred to God as the gardener. In this parable, God is responsible for pruning the vine. The unproductive parts are cut away, so that growth is encouraged. Jesus is telling us that God will prune our lives, not to harm us, but to encourage our spiritual growth.

God's pruning cuts away wrong attitudes and wasteful behaviour, all of which serve no useful purpose in our lives. This pruning is required to make us more fruitful. And the fruit God wants is love, joy, patience, peace, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness & self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23) These holy qualities are intended to influence the world to change it from the bad to all that is good.

Also in this parable, Jesus said He was the Vine, and we are the branches. In the same way a vine utilises the life-giving sap to flow into the branches, so we need the Holy Spirit to flow into us. Jesus said, 'Abide in Me' (John 15:4). Abiding speaks of sustenance,

being upheld, and supported, enduring and withstanding.

If we are to reap a harvest that sees our community as a centre for abundant love, compassion, gracious giving, and generous hospitality, then may we be prepared for God's pruning, and continue to abide in Jesus, receiving the transforming power of the Holy Spirit to make us good stewards of all the wonderful gifts we have been given.

Have a blessed September, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

Over the last few weeks I have been inundated by residents concerned about the plans to close rail ticket offices across the constituency. From older residents who often struggle to buy tickets online to young women who worry about their safety and getting off at stations with no staff to ask for help. While the rail companies say that closing the ticket offices would mean staff would be available on platforms instead, my experience is that while this does happen at the beginning of any change, after a while these staff are moved on and you end up with unmanned stations.

It is because of these concerns that I have encouraged residents to feed into the consultation that the rail companies are running on these closures. The rail companies have been so overwhelmed by the response that they have extended the consultation on rail ticket office closures by six weeks, allowing more residents to have their say.

The process for train operators to propose any changes to the opening hours of ticket offices or to close ticket offices is set out in the Ticketing and Settlement Agreement. The agreement regulates what train operators do regarding fares, ticketing and retailing across the network and requires train operators to put notices at the station advising passengers of any proposals and what any changes could mean for them.

I have been overwhelmed with the response from local people and as I share the concerns over closure, I am urging people to keep sending their responses in, if they have not yet done so.

Many people thought the short consultation period was unfair and would not give people enough time to find out about it and respond, so I am pleased that it has been extended by six weeks. If any residents have yet to take part in the consultation and have concerns about the proposed closure of ticket offices, please do make use of the consultations extension and make your views heard. The consultation will now close on Friday 1st September.

Monday September 8th. The children return to school after a long spell of absence owing to sickness and the holidays. We are thankful that they are all apparently well and that the epidemic of measles has not left any evil consequences. We shall never know here how much of this is due to the earnest and persistent prayers that went up from the Altar for these children. We have learnt the folly of too literal obedience to the preposterous demands of a cast iron system of school attendance. We shall know better next time.

Note: Measles is highly infectious and can lead to severe complications and sometimes death. Worryingly recently uptake of the vaccine has dropped and many teenagers and young people are now vulnerable to this dangerous disease. London in particular could see a measles outbreak in the near future with thousands of cases. It seems we do not know better after all!

CHAILEY REPAIR CAFÉ CELEBRATES ITS 5th BIRTHDAY!

Who would have thought when we first opened our doors on 11th August 2018, we would grow so quickly and achieve so much? Each month, we take on up to 80 repairs, some of which have a remarkable history.

Last month, we took on a 1930s model boat which had belonged to Stella's older brother Derek. At the end of the 2nd World War Derek gave it to a friend Ian, who was just ten. As they grew up, Stella became more interested in Ian than his toys. They became sweethearts, but that ended when Ian chose a life in the Navy.

Some seventy years later, and after she was widowed, Ian phoned Stella. He visited her - and stayed - bringing the boat with him. Ian and Stella married in 2022, but sadly Ian died in March this year.

After being beautifully restored by one of Chailey Repair Café's skilled volunteers, Stella has now given the boat to Derek's grandson. It not only continues to give pleasure, but also stands as a reminder of a special time and a relationship that endured. (See our Facebook page for the full story)

Chailey Repair Café is part of a world-wide movement where volunteer experts repair things free of charge – although a donation towards running costs is invited. Anyone can bring along broken items or clothing needing repair from home, and have a cuppa and a cake and then watch while your repair is done in front of you.

You'll find us at St Peter's Church, Chailey on the A275 at Chailey Green normally on the second Saturday of each month (12th August, 9th September and so on) between 1000hrs and 1300hrs where we have a full Café service including our legendary cakes!

Chailey Horticultural Society

Our next event is the autumn show on 9th September in the village hall with the doors opening at 2.30.

Despite a very high standard of exhibits and a lovely tea on offer we still fail to appeal to a wider public so please spread the word that a most pleasant, informative and social time can be had at our shows.

Since my last article the weather has completely changed with lower temperatures and decent rainfall. Despite all the benefits the weeds are in danger of taking control and it is vital to keep on top of them or all will soon be lost under a mass of unwanted vegetation. Fortunately the hosepipe band has been lifted.

Keep regularly picking and watering runner and French beans and with luck they will crop well into October. Harvest courgettes and cucumbers before they set seeds and they also should continue to produce through a hopefully mild autumn.

Dig main crop potatoes, clean and dry but only store those that are perfect as one rotten spud can ruin a whole sack.

By the end of the month the chances of outside tomatoes ripening is greatly reduced and it is probably best to pick them and keep them in a light warm place perhaps with a rotten banana to continue ripening.

Harvest sweet corn. It is often difficult to know whether the cob is ripe or not. The tassel should be completely brown and drooping. Peel back a bit of the covering leaves to expose the cob and check for ripeness.

It is not too late to plant chard and winter lettuce or buy plug plants.

Thoughts should also turn to various sorts of bulb. Let's start with autumn onions sets and garlic. Autumn sown onions are well worth it as once established they require little attention and will be ready by the end of June or early July. The ones to choose from are Radar and Senshyu. Plant in early October by placing the set in a small hole with the top just showing. Do not push in as this may damage the growing plate. They tend to be

milder and more moist than main crop varieties and hence don't store so well. Growing your own garlic is easy and great fun. There are two main types , hard neck which produces a flower stalk and soft neck which doesn't. Hard neck are more cold resistant but don't store so well. In our climate both sorts do well and there is a huge variety to choose from. Autumn planting for garlic is much preferable to spring planting as a period of cold and arrested growth produces a bigger better flavoured bulb. I'll deal with shallots next time as they can be planted in November. Other bulbs include hyacinth and narcissi. Growing hyacinths in a bowl for Christmas or our spring show is well worth it. Always use bulb fibre rather than soil as the later tends to get waterlogged and may rot the bulb. Place them about an inch apart with the top just showing. It is about 12 to 14 weeks between planting and flowering depending largely on temperature. Airing cupboard for quick growth or a cold conservatory for slower growth. Here's hoping for a warm sunny autumn with sufficient rain. Hope to see you at our autumn show

Chailey Commons Society

We can really cheer ourselves up after the rainy start to the summer holidays with some exciting news!

Campaigners from Chailey Commons Society (CCS) have welcomed the decision by the Planning Inspectorate to prevent the construction of electricity substations on two areas of Chailey Commons Local Nature Reserve (LNR).

Having received the decision of the Planning Inspectorate, the Society is encouraged with the recognition that the value of the North Common LNR is important and safeguarded for the local and wider community. This rare heathland habitat is of national importance as only 20 % of UK heathland still survives, so must be carefully preserved in its entirety. By refusing this application the Planning Inspectorate have saved our much-loved common land and species that are restricted to these historic landscapes.

Our Butterfly walk took place on a very windy afternoon on Memorial Common and we doubted if we would see any. There were, however, sheltered areas where we were rewarded with sightings of many meadow browns and gate keepers and a variety of others including Red Admiral, Brimstone, Large White, Ringlets, Peacocks and Comma.

This Summer nightjar have been heard on Red House Common, Memorial, Pound and Romany Ridge commons often located in or close to the refuges. Thank you for respecting the refuges and keeping your dogs under control on the commons. Signs have now been removed.

Cattle are now grazing for the summer on the commons and are moved in rotation between Red House Common and the lower commons. Please let Andy Mitchell, the Countryside Officer know if any are signs are missing. Please also report any issues

with gates or fences to him by email Andy.Mitchell@eastsussex.gov.uk. If there are any problems with the cattle, please report this to the farmer directly on 07710 031820.

We are looking for a new pony checker to join our team who monitor the four Exmoor ponies on Red House Common daily. Each person checks them two days a month – whatever the weather! We can give some basic training and lots of support from the team. Please contact JoJo if you are interested jojo.way88@gmail.com

Chailey Parish Council Updates

The new Noticeboard has recently been installed in North Chailey at the mini roundabouts. If you have any local notices to put on any of the parish boards, please contact one of the clerks on 01825 722388.

Graffiti – most of it has now been cleaned off of the bus shelters and the road signs. South East Water have also repainted their box on the A275 and installed trellis to protect it. Unfortunately the Horns Lodge has now been subjected to even more graffiti. The building is privately owned but the Parish Clerk has asked Lewes District Council to look at their legal powers to see if anything can be done to clean up the building and also the rest of the site.

The telephone Box is well on the way to being transformed into a library. The inside painting has been completed, the solar light and shelves will be installed soon, and at the same time the outside will also be given a new bright red coat of paint. When it's completed we will be asking for donations of books but it isn't quite ready yet so please hang on to any books you have for just a little longer.

At the last full council meeting, the annual round of small grants were agreed and grants are on their way to 10 local organisations – Chailey Rainbows, Chailey Brownies, Chailey & Newick Painting Club, Chailey Commons Society, Chailey Bonfire Society, Chailey Allotment Association, The Monday Group, Chailey Cricket Club, Chailey Evening Women's Institute and the Windmill District Guides.

Councillors also co-opted John Rice on to the Parish Council – we welcome John, who has a professional background in Local Authority work, and look forward to working with him.

All of the agendas and minutes of previous meetings are on the website www.Chailey.org, together with information about planning applications and latest news. All of our meetings are open to members of the public.

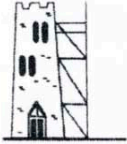

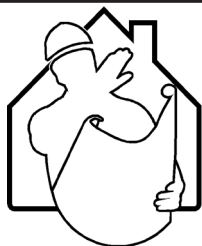
